Town Manager Report for April 11, 2022 meeting:

1. Fran & Bruce Staples have been notified of their appointment with the Selectboard and apologized for being unable to attend on 3/28. The full EU rate for this building is \$308.61 per quarter. The vacancy rate for this building is \$239.56, a difference of \$69.05. The next bill will be issued in May for April, May and June.
2. We will discuss ideas for American Rescue Plan money. I have posted invitations around Town, Kelly has posted on Facebook, Front Porch Forum and our website. We have received some feedback and it is in your packet.
3. There are some reappointments in your packet to committees. The Revolving Loan Fund is a committee that has been made up of three people in the past. Carroll's passing left an opening with the possibility of another retiring. Four people have expressed interest, two with a banking background, one State Representative/small business owner/BRI member, and one small business owner. I assume you are going to want to stay to a three-to-four-member committee size. You may choose to appoint only two of the four interested. We have someone interested in Health Officer, but he was discussing it with his family so hopefully we will have his answer on Monday.
4. Per Chris's suggestion, I reviewed all of the current loan packages we have. We can refinance the Kansas State Bank loan for the 2017 Kenworth Tanker. It was a variable rate for the last 5 years (2027-2031). If we refinance now, we can drop our current rate and fix our future rate. The Vermont Municipal Bond Bank constantly monitors their loans and if better financing opportunities arise, they automatically refund and reissue. I have contacted Mascoma Bank regarding our debt retirement loan. They are discussing in house – if they are willing to turn the latter portion of our loan to a fixed rate. Two of the eight loans are set with good interest rates.
5. I have discussed the mowing bids with Cemetery Commissioner Cecil Washburn and he is all set.
6. I have hired Greg Bahr to repair the stonewall at the municipal parking lot and will provide you with all of the details after my meeting with him in the next week or two.
7. Road Foreman Allen Patton has given his notice and his last day will be April 22, 2022. We wish him the best with all of his future endeavors. Myself, Ryan Slack and someone TBD will start interviewing next week.
8. I have submitted our paving grant application – thank you Chris for your help and will submit the structures grant application next week.

Town of Bethel Selectboard Minutes for Monday, March 28, 2022

Present: Lindley Brainard, David Eddy, Chris Jarvis, Gene Kraus, Paul Valley, Therese Kirby, Julie Kraus. Recorded by ORCA Media.

Visitors: Gary Kessler, Owen Daniel-McCarter and Laura Woods

6 pm: Chris called the meeting to order. Therese asked to move the Killington Stage Request up to an appointment slot, as Gary Kessler was present via Zoom. Lindley moved to approve the agenda as amended. Dave second. Passed.

6:05 pm: Fran & Bruce Staples re: their request to extend their vacant water rate for three months. This discussion was moved to later on the agenda when the Staples are present.

6:15 pm: Laura Woods re: Tree Warden. Laura Woods is interested in becoming Bethel's Tree Warden, a position that was vacated several months ago. Laura outlined her experience and desire to serve her community.

Motion made by Lindley, to appoint Laura Woods as Bethel's Tree Warden for one year. Passed.

Killington Stage Race request to use portion of North Road on 5/29/2022 for approx. 2 hours Gary Kessler was here to represent the Killington Stage Race and explained the race map and times. There will be sheriffs and local police on the course to control on Rt. 12 and North Road intersection and EMS personnel with ambulances standing by. The Race is promoted by USA Cycling. The State Police and VTrans have already approved the race. Motion made by Paul to approve the request of the Killington Stage Race to use a portion of North Road and Rt. 12 on 5/29/2022 for approximately 2 hours and for the Selectboard Chair or Town Manager to sign the authorization. Passed.

Fran and Bruce Staples requested another three month extension of their vacancy water and sewer rate. The Staples did not appear at this meeting. The Selectboard discussed the question of how long the Town should keep extending the vacancy rate. At the moment, the Staples are receiving a \$69.05 discount for water/sewer. The Selectboard will defer the decision until the Staples appear at the next meeting on April 11, 2022

Public Comment: Ele Gifford reported on the VOREC event where the grants were officially announced by Governor Scott Ferron Griffin and Gene Kraus also attended the event. The Governor spoke to recipients and shared what the requests covered. Other towns are doing some amazing outdoor projects. From the money available, twenty-four grants were approved. Bethel's grant is approximately 1/15 of the total monies available, at \$331, 809, and the 2nd largest grant approved. Bethel's application was noted as the best written application. Rebecca Stone was thanked for a job well done! Number one priority now, is finding someone to oversee the grant.

A letter of appreciation will be sent to Neal. Chris noted that we often forget the large amount of time residents give to the Town. Therese recommended raising the amount of stipend for the positions of Health Officer and Deputy Health Officer. It can remain a stipend, or could be changed to a set hourly rate with time card. Discussion of temporary appointment. They if unsure if the new Health Officer would fill the remainder of Neal's position or if a new person would be for a 3-year term. She will ask the Department of Health that, if the person needs to be a Bethel resident and how many deputies there can be.

The Selectboard agreed to table the Health Officer vacancy decision until the 4/11 meeting. Board members can reach out to residents of Bethel to see if someone is interested in filling the position, and Therese will advertise the opening. At the moment, the responsibilities of the Health Officer default to the Chair of the Selectboard. All members are encouraged to refer any interested people to the Town Office.

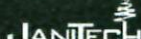
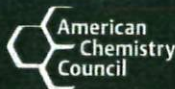

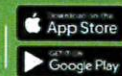
