- I have hired Philip Robinson for the Utility Position and he starts May 20th. Dietre, Denise and I have been interviewing for the Pool Director. Pam and I have been interviewing for the Asst. Town Clerk/ Lister Office Admin.
- We have received a couple of prices on completing the work on Upper Gilead. I will hire a contractor this week.
- The water project meeting will be Tuesday, May 14th at 9am at Town Hall.

WHEREAS, Examination of the project area shows that <u>overhead lines and poles</u> that appear to carry utility company-owned <u>power</u>, internet, cable, and phone lines are in conflict with the Project plans; and

WHEREAS, The Town has provided affected utility companies advance notice of the intended work, has sought and considered input from the affected utility companies, and has coordinated with the affected utility companies regarding their need to complete timely relocations as soon as practical; and

WHEREAS, The Town desires to avoid delays, inconvenience or damage sustained by the selected contractor due to interference from said utilities, appurtenances, or the operation of moving them; and

WHEREAS, If the utilities are not moved in a timely manner, it will likely result in inconvenience to the traveling public, and unnecessarily increased costs for the Project and the Town; and

WHEREAS, Vermont Statutes Annotated, Title 19, Section 1111(a)(3) (as amended by Sec. 18 of Act No. 38 of 2017), provides, in relevant part:

When the Agency or a municipality issues a utility relocation or adjustment order in accordance with law in connection with highway maintenance or construction activities, and a utility fails to move or adjust its line or other facility within the time specified in the order, that utility shall be liable to the State or to the municipality for damages that the State or the municipality is required to pay a contractor for delay caused by the failure.

and

WHEREAS, Vermont Statutes Annotated, Title 30, Section 2504, provides, in relevant part:

If a line of wires is erected or maintained upon, under or across a street or highway, contrary to the direction of the Transportation Board or the selectmen, or is not changed when directed by them, they may remove such line, and recover the expense thereof from the person or corporation using the same in an action on this statute.

THAT THE INDICATED DATE IS THAT WHICH THE LAST UTILITY IS REQUIRED TO HAVE ITS MOVE COMPLETE; AND

THAT ALL UTILITIES SHALL COORDINATE THEIR SCHEDULES SO AS TO ACCOMMODATE THIS DATE; AND

THE COST OF REMOVING SUCH LINES WILL BE SOUGHT AND RECOUPED FROM THE OWNERS OF SUCH LINES; AND

THE COST OF ANY DELAY CLAIMS FILED BY THE PROJECT CONTRACTOR WILL BE SOUGHT AND RECOUPED FROM THE OWNERS OF SUCH LINES.

6 pm: Chair Chris Jarvis called the meeting to order. The Board amended the agenda to add annual approval of the Local Emergency Management Plan (LEMP). Dave Eddy moved, Denise Guilmette seconded, to approve the agenda as amended. So voted.

6:03 pm: Dubois & King re: option of wall repair or no wall repair for Pleasant Street Sidewalk Project Chris Lathrop of Dubois & King and Rita Seto of TRORC. (See the Selectboard Packet for details.) Dave Eddy, Denise Guilmette, Chris Jarvis, Paul Vallee approved the 3A option to repair the wall.

6.15 pm: Geo Honigford, Town of Royalton re: Royalton reclassifying their section of Perham Road to trail. Discussion if Bethel is interested in same. Suggest renaming the trail "Wild Cat Trail." Dave Eddy spoke to clarify any confusion of where the two roads connect. The Selectboard referred the question to the Class 4 Road Committee for their input.

6:30 pm: Bethel ATV Club, Richard Manning re: annual approval of trails. (map in packet). Richard said due to a change in land ownership, they were requesting approval to use approximately ¾ of a mile from the 4 corners of Dart Hill to Campbell Road to Bryant Road. There will be speed enforcement and speed signs posted. They will provide an updated map to the office. Denise Guilmette moved, Dave Eddy seconded, to approve the trail request for the Bethel ATV Club, with updated map to be provided. So voted.

6:45 pm: Interim Fire Chief Geary Coogler re: discussion and motion to approve Fire Department Advisory Board (See the Packet for Details).

Interim Chief Geary Coogler explained his would be an advisory board, not be an oversight board. The purpose would be to help reduce the work load of the Chief, increase workflow efficiency, etc. Interim Chief Cooler feels there are enough people with the requested qualifications (prior fire fighter, living in Bethel, left BFD in good standing and one local business person) to staff this board. He explained the history of how this idea/Board came to be. Assistant Chief Greg Timmons was also present and is in support of the Board. Geary will continue developing this board and report back to the Selectboard.

Denise Guilmette moved, Dave Eddy seconded, to approve the formation of a Fire Department Advisory Board.

Public Comment

Brian Wright spoke about the pot hole patching on Gilead Road. Chris Jarvis explained that the road needs to be taken to its base and rebuilt before repaving. Following the current schedule for road repair, this extensive work is not due to be repaved for 5-7years. The work is not eligible for grant funding. Brian suggested removing the pavement and taking it back to dirt. Chris explained we discussed that option with some residents of Gilead, but some of those living on pavement were opposed. Chris recommends taking the road down to dirt until the repaving can begin but agrees this approach will not solve the current problems. Geoff Gilman suggested larger patches instead of just pot hole patching.

Ele Griffin from the Recreation Committee reported continued damage at the Recreation Center (purple paint, ice rink liner ruined, signage damaged). The Sheriff's Department will be notified.

Paul Vallee moved, Dave Eddy seconded, to approve the Creek House Diner, LLC request for a first-class liquor license and Babe's Bar request for a special event permit/outside consumption permit at Babe's on 5/18/24 from 6 pm to 12 am and an outside consumption permit 2 pm to 12 am Tuesday through Sunday. So voted.

Killington Stage Race re: annual approval for event on Sunday, May 26, 2024, use of North Road from 10 am to noon.

Denise Guilmette moved, Dave Eddy seconded, to approve the request of Killington Stage Race for their annual event on Sunday, May 26, 2024, for the use of North Road from 10 am to noon. So voted.

This shows up in the audit and can be reviewed during budget time.

TOWN OF BETHEL TRUSTEE OF PUBLIC FUNDS 3/25/2024 Minutes (Draft)

Members Attending: Rick Benson, Sandy Farrell, Scott Putney

Public Attending: None

The meeting was opened at 3:00 by former Chair Benson.

The first order of business was to elect officers for the ensuing year. Scott Putney was elected as Chair, Rick Benson Secretary, and Sandy Farrell as Treasurer.

The next item was the discussion of the Town Attorney's review of the Cox, Whitcomb and Clark wills and future maintenance of the funds regarding reinvestment of the annual income from the investments of the bequeaths. Attorney Robert Fletcher's review determined that:

The Clark Estate has no restrictions on investing, only that it be used for the benefit of the schools in the town of Bethel.

The Cox Will restricts the school from using any of the principal, but does not require the school to use **all** of the annual income. As a result the TPF have the discretion to designate the reinvested income and interest......to provide more accessible funds if doing so would be in the best interest of the schools.

The Whitcomb fund, on the other hand, stipulates that the income be only used each year for the current expenses of the school and cannot be reinvested and used to increase the value of the trust.

It was decided that a meeting with the Northfield Savings Bank investment advisor who is handling the funds be scheduled to determine how to properly direct the Clark and Cox fund investments going forward. Chair Putney will handle the organization of that meeting.

S. Farrell mentioned that there are and additional eight wills that we are handling bequeathed funds from and would like to locate the copies of the wills to see what guidelines are required for these funds as well. Chair Putney agreed to go through the archives in the Town Office to see if they can be located. If not, we will investigate obtaining copies from the Vermont Probate Court. Once obtained, the Trustees will meet to determine how to best manage those funds moving forward. The Trustees will also

maintain a folder to include all of the wills in one place for future reference.

Other Business:

Treasurer Farrell provided a Balance Sheet as of 12/31/2023 of all of the funds currently maintained by the Trustees. Upon reviewing the document, a question arose regarding the handling of the cemetery funds, including burial lot rents, etc. Therese Kirby, Bethel Town Manager was available and was asked to clarify the management of the various funds. Her explanation was that the Trustees only manage bequeathed funds, while the Town handles all other funds as well as the maintenance of the cemeteries. S. Farrell asked whether the Trustees had the power to transfer the cemetery funds under their control to the Town. It was decided to wait until the wills are reviewed before making any decisions on that topic.

Chair Putney proposed that we revise the entry into the annual Town Report to include comparisons year to year as well as a short review of the actions of the Trustees over the course of the year.

S. Farrell made mention that she would likely not run for re-election when her term expires in 2026. Considering the importance of the Treasurer's position, it was determined that the group, in the mean time, should be looking for a suitable replacement to carry on Sandy's excellent work in that position.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:12PM.

- B. In attendance were Shane Kinsley, Chris Fors, Caleb Haywood, Lindsey Schell, Maureen Judge, Ele Griffin, and Kyle Cartwright on the phone.
- C. Ice Rink: Ele thanked everyone for coming out on Saturday the 20th to take care of the liner so that the rink frame could be picked up for this year. The frame was picked up Tuesday the 23rd. Thus we are done for the season. We hope we have a better ice skating season weather wise next year.
- D. Skateboard Park: Good News. The last work to be done at the park will be next week Monday, May 6th. With so many people climbing over the orange fence and using the park it will be great to finally have projects done, orange fence down, and park open to everyone. Ele noted that she has seen cracks in the structure. Shane told us that rebar is close to the surface of the concrete and provides structure in spite of the cracks. Hopefully, the cracks are superficial. The committee is still planning to have an Opening Party on Saturday, June 1st from 2 to 4 pm. At the next Select board meeting Ele will confirm the event. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Since not all members had received the minutes of the meeting of March 21, 2024, Dana moved to defer approval of those minutes until the meeting on May 16, 2004. The motion passed unanimously.

There was no public comment.

Eric reviewed the reporting and warning requirements for public meetings and the quorum definition for planning commissions described in the Vermont Open Meeting Law.

Discussion of updates to the Town Plan as adopted in 2020 began with Dana leading a walk-through of his edits and updates to the Land Use chapter, including questions about format and specific content. After a wide-ranging discussion of the Land Use chapter and the parameters of the Town Plan as an integrated document, the Commission agreed that particular goals, such as those Dana included in his review, are essential to the plan's effectiveness in all chapters, particularly land use.

The conversation stimulated several ideas to create a more lucid and proactive document that the Commission can propose to the Town in 2025.

Sam suggested we each log on to the websites of other towns to examine their town plans. TRORC's site also contains valuable information regarding drafting and approving town plans.

Chuck began an overview of the Flood Resilience chapter by emphasizing that this has become an ominous subject. Flooding has become a threat to the existence of many towns and cities, and it will remain a feature of life in the

coming years. The Commission will review this chapter before the next meeting when we intend to approve the final draft.

The Community Health and Wellness chapter, updated by Chuck, is near its final draft stage and may be ready for approval at the May 16 meeting. A salient topic of this chapter is the demographic influence of the average age of Bethel's and Vermont's aging population, and the planning challenges it presents.

A brief discussion of file management, edit tracking, and status reporting ended with an agreement that while members may edit their chapters on our Google Drive, Sam will track files and maintain the folders on the drive. Following a chapter's final review, the Commission will approve it by a motion and a vote.

Adjournment:

At 8:36 pm, Dana seconded Allan's motion for adjournment, and the motion passed unanimously.

Congratulations! I am pleased to inform you that at its meeting on April 22, 2024, the Downtown Development Board found Bethel's renewal application for the village center designation met the statutory requirements (24 VSA Chapter 76A). The designated village center will be eligible for benefits for the next eight years, until May 2032. At that time, the Town of Bethel will need to renew its designation. The Department of Housing and Community Development will send out a renewal reminder six months prior to the renewal date. Please note that a Neighborhood Development Area added prior to that date will be up for renewal at the same time as the underlying designation.

Our team will check in with the municipality annually to offer support, share updated information, tools, and resources related to the designation, and to ensure our local contact information is up-to-date.

UPPER VALLEY LAKE SUNAPEE REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION SELECTED FOR \$1.18 MILLION GRANT TO SUPPORT TRANSPORTATION RESILIENCE PROJECTS WITH TWO RIVERS-OTTAUQUECHEE REGIONAL COMMISSION IN NH AND VT

On Monday, the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) announced the selection of the Upper Valley Lake Sunapee Regional Planning Commission (UVLSRPC) as a recipient of a \$1,188,443 Thriving Communities Regional Pilot Capacity Builder grant. In partnership with Two Rivers-Ottauquechee Regional Commission (TRORC), UVLSRPC will use these funds to support under-resourced and disadvantaged communities in identifying, developing, and delivering transportation projects to achieve locally-driven economic development, health, environment, mobility, and access goals. These communities include Acworth, Charlestown, Enfield, Goshen, Lebanon, Lempster, Orford, and Plainfield in New Hampshire; and Bethel, Granville, Hancock, Hartford, Hartland, and Royalton in Vermont.

Through the grant, UVLSRPC and TRORC will increase capacity in the Upper Valley Region via two Resilience Coordinators who support resilience planning and technical assistance with a long-term goal of peer-learning and capacity building across the states. The 14 communities committed to participate in this pilot program have been devastated by increased precipitation events and flooding that has greatly impacted the transportation network, the local and regional economy, and access to services and healthcare during times of emergency. The Resilience Coordinators will contribute knowledge to municipalities and enable a more community-based approach to improving flood resilience of transportation infrastructure.

UVLSRPC and TRORC were identified as best suited to support the work in this proposal as experts in climate resilience and transportation planning with decades of experience in quantitative, data-driven rationale of community needs. The commissions also hold long-term relationships with state agencies and individuals in the towns they serve, providing a qualitative window into the daily struggles of rural, isolated communities with disadvantaged transportation systems. According to Peter Gregory, Executive Director of TRORC, "We are pleased to be

partnering on another important initiative with UVLSRPC. Both organizations are committed to improving the safety and quality of life for the region's residents".

The DOT Thriving Communities Program supports two years of no-cost technical assistance to disadvantaged communities. The program's National Capacity Builder grant aids communities assigned by DOT, and the Regional Capacity Builder grant, of which UVLSRPC is a recipient, enables participants to provide Thriving Communities Program activities to communities at a state or regional scale. The program is part of the Justice40 Initiative and interagency Thriving Communities Network, supporting access to funding and resources provided by the President Biden's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.


